Wexford Primary Schools Activity



- Primary school focus for January & February 2023 has been hurling projects including 1. class coaching,
 2. Hurling365, 3. Caman Everybody & 4. After School Hurling programmes.
- 1. Primary school coaching with GPOs in 42 Schools & CE coaching in 18 Schools. Recruitment of 4 new GPOs in the coming weeks will increase the number of schools receiving coaching significantly.

2. Hurlng365 survey sent to clubs in January 2023 found 73% of clubs partake in Hurling365 currently, with a relaunch on March 22nd to refocus clubs & drive club school links. James Flynn will coordinate Hurling365 going forward.

3 Caman Everybody is an initiative aimed at Junior/Senior infants where the kids receive coaching in 5 key areas of hurling. This is a Wexford Coaching project designed by GPOs Seamus Byrne & Al Monahan. The idea is to ensure as many children have an understanding of the following areas at an early age:

- Dribble
- Solo
- Handling
- Roll Lift
- C Swing

- Delivery of Athletic Development to Wexford Model Og Academy & Post Primary School players in 2022/23 has commenced with the launch of the Integrated Athletic Development pathway
- This Pathway is lead by Performance GDA Eoin Devine O Grady
- This pathway provides expert athletic development to players in their school enviroment, in a safe & supervised manner.
- This programme provides oppoetnities for school/squad players to develop their athleticism during their school day & allows focus to remaim on their education
- Over 350 post primary students across 6 schools currently partake in the initative with plans to increase to over 500 in 2023
- The integrated athletic development programme for January & February has overseen 60 athletic development sessions in 7 schools with 800 students involved.

Club Coach Education

- Formal coach education alongside our informal coaching workshops has been a busy area for our GPOs & GDAs
- Introduction to Coaching Gaelic Games courses commenced in January 2023 & so far with 180 participants.
- 6 more courses to start in March with approx. 120 more participants.
- 4 Award 1 courses have commenced with 80 participants currently upskilling to Award 1 level
- Demand for formal coach education is high in Wexford & we continue to work hard & meet the expectations.

Model Ogs Academy Development Squads

- Wexford Og Model Academy development squads season 2023 commenced in January with trials for U14, U15 & U16 Hurling & Football players
- Over 6 weeks of trials squads were narrowed to panels of 48 players
- From March until August the squad players will be taking part in weekly sessions that are designed to develop their understanding of the game
- Priority in relation to coaching will be the following areas:

1. Tactical Play

2.Team play

3. Technical Play

- Players will be challenged in a learning environment that is player centered & developmental focused
- New dual player policy is now in effect which aims to have larger percentage of single code players at each age.
- Unlimited dual players at U14
- 85% single code players at UI5
- 90% single code players at U16
- Each squad will consist of 48 players for 2023

Policies & Procedures Update

• Following an extensive review, implementation of updated policy & procedures were introduced to development squad coaches.

• Development of squad coaches to ensure they have the necessary skills to deliver the highest standard of coaching in Wexford is a key principle for 2023.

• Coach education is vital principle to achieve best practice coaching & the 3 steps below outline our objective:

1. Become part of a supportive coaching community where you can ask questions and debate topics relevant to your practice with other coaches.

2. Improve your coaching skills and knowledge through a mixture of classroom sessions, interactive presentations, pitch sessions and discussions with Coach Developers and expert coaches.

3. Receive access to follow up resources to reinforce learning and aid future development.

- Parents of development squad players are invited to the squad launch on March 14th in Riverside Park Hotel at 7.30pm where we will be outlining expectations & procedures for squad players, parents & mentors for 2023
- Similarly, club coaches will be invited to a meeting on April 18th to build an understanding of the role a development squad can play with club players & to ease any concerns regarding player expectations.
