# Freshtoday Sponsor Hurling365

Wexford GAA are delighted to announce that Freshtoday are our new sponsors of Hurling 365. Hurling365 commenced as an initiative in 2013 when the hurling advisory committee led by Liam Griffin and Willie Cleary devised the concept of increasing the opportunity for children to play our national game. The programme takes place outside school hours but within the school setting – either before or after school – where teachers, club coaches and Games Promotion Officers assist in coaching children from Infants up to 6th class. The project has grown from its inception and an evaluation study conducted in January 2020 found that there has been a phenomenal growth in participation with over 80% of pupils in Co Wexford participating.

Cathaoirleach of Wexford GAA, Micheál Martin, welcomed Freshtoday on board as main sponsors of Hurling365 stating, "Freshtoday have been a longstanding corporate sponsor of Wexford GAA and we are delighted that they have taken the opportunity to partner with us to bring the Hurling 365 initiative to a new level."

- Following from previous workshops aimed at nursery, go games level coaches, Thursdays workshop focused on youth coaches.
- Over 60 coaches from a variety of clubs attended a damp Chadwick's Wexford Park & left with some key coaching points in addition to drills & games that they can bring back to their clubs
- Key coaching points included:
- 1. Hard support runs on/off the ball
- 2. Delivery zones
- 3. Timing of runs in forwards
- Drills & games focused on
- 1. Tackling/Hooking
- 2. Transition from attack to defence
- 3. Transition Play/Delivery

### **Wexford Club Football Representative**

Following a comprehensive review of Football in Wexford by Philip Wallace, committees have been set up to look at both club & county football & make recommendations for the progression of both.

The committees are lead by Chairmen David Murphy & Seamus Hughes with support from members Jim Carberry, Padraig Cronin, Colm Morris & Ray Harris. More committee members to be added where availability suits participants.

Initially clubs throughout Wexford have been asked to create a football club representative who were invited to a meeting in Chadwick Wexford Park on April 18th

Thanks to all who attended the first Football development committee meeting on Wednesday 19th April. Initially the focus will be on how we can improve at club level. Below is a summary of what each club rep(s) will endeavour to undertake over the coming weeks and month:

- Discuss, talk and chat positively about football coaching and participation especially at underage.
- Highlight the similarities and correlations between football and hurling
- Be a point of contact in the club with regard to county coaching courses. Inform & encourage club coaches to attend such events as they happen, starting with Wexford Park May 8th
- Promote and encourage the principal of football training/coaching sessions the week of games
- Be point of contact with regard to details and schedule of County Development squads. Actively encourage parents and kids to attend. Liaise with Development squad managers or others, when required to maximise participation
- Provide regular feedback to this group with regard to positives, negatives and/or suggestions
- Identify very coaches in the club that may get involved with Development squads

## **Wexford Club Coaching Workshop**



- Football Coaching Workshop took place on May 8th Chadwick's Wexford Park
- This workshop was the latest in the Wexford way coach education pathway that has previously held workshops in areas for participation such as nursery & go games
- The aim of the football workshop is for youth player development & team performance
- · Key points from the workshop
- 1. Transition Play/Overland/Shooting
- 2. Attacking a set Defence System
- 3. Movement ahead of the ball


The Model Academy is the platform where emerging players and coaches in Wexford are challenged and tested.
